DUNKIN' CONNECTING JOY FOUNDATION FUNDS NEW STATE-OF-THE-ART GAMING PROGRAM AT CSH NEW BRUNSWICK

Children's Specialized Hospital Foundation is honored to have received a \$38,400 Connecting Joy Grant from the Dunkin' Joy in Childhood Foundation. This grant provides endless entertainment for our patients with three Fully Loaded Electronics (FLE) mobile gaming carts, a PlayStation5, and Xbox Series S, 15 adaptive Nintendo Switches, an interactive mobile floor cube, four ceiling projectors, two Apple iPads, a Snoezelen Deluxe Mini Cart, and various other state-of-the-art gaming accessories.



The Dunkin' Joy in Childhood Foundation, the charitable foundation supported by Dunkin' and the generosity of its franchisees, guests, vendor partners and employees, provides the simple joys of childhood to kids battling hunger or illness. The Foundation partners with food banks, children's hospitals and nonprofit organizations to fund joyful environments and joyful experiences for kids when they need it most. Since 2006, the Joy in Childhood Foundation has granted more than \$30 million to hundreds of national and local charities across the country.

Gaming equipment plays a crucial role in the rehabilitation process and helps patients remain emotionally stable. It provides them with an opportunity to escape from their sometimes overwhelming rehabilitation journey and just be children again. Additionally, gaming offers a healthy outlet for stress and an opportunity to bond with their peers.

Katie Ahlers, CTRS, Inpatient Recreation Therapy/Child Life Supervisor at CSH New Brunswick stated, "Games are a huge part of our recreation/child life programming and having the latest in gaming technology helps us to create an inviting environment in our rec room for patients and families. From the newest video game consoles to the interactive projector and the sensory cart, we now have something for everyone to enjoy regardless of cognitive or physical abilities. It has been amazing to see patients of all ages come out of their rooms, increase their opportunities for socialization, and have fun playing with our new gaming equipment."

The new equipment offers an inclusive environment for all patients by providing adaptive equipment, like the adaptive Nintendo Switches, which allow patients to have easier movement solutions than a standard game controller provides. Moreover, gaming equipment is now available for patients who are too medically fragile to leave their bed, allowing games to be provided bedside.

"Here at FLE, we're proud to supply gaming systems that provide entertainment and distraction when kids need it most. Kids need to play, even in the hospital," said Rachelle Lee, VP of Operations, FLE. "Playing an Xbox, Nintendo or PlayStation while at the hospital provides some normalcy for kids who may have their whole life disrupted. Trying over and over to beat a level builds tenacity and resilience. Winning a game empowers them when they may otherwise feel helpless or scared. Most importantly, gaming gives kids a way to interact and have fun with family, siblings, and even staff, creating a bond and trust between kiddos and the hospital staff who care for them. Video game carts are so much more than video games."

The gaming program also provides new opportunities for recreational therapy sessions utilizing play, recreation, and leisure activities to improve kids' physical, cognitive, social, and emotional abilities. Gaming helps therapists to identify, improve and enhance functional abilities and independence. Additionally, it assists in community integration by placing patients in situations that challenge the skills acquired during their rehab stay and applies them in a practical community setting, preparing them for their discharge home.

CSH FOUNDATION REACHES \$45 MILLION GOAL TO COMPLETE THE TRANSFORMING LIVES 2.0 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Thanks to our donors, Children's Specialized Hospital (CSH) Foundation completed the largest fundraising campaign with the greatest impact in our history in July 2023. For three years, we rallied our community to step up for New Jersey's kids living with special healthcare needs and the call was answered with eagerness and passion.

The results of this unprecedented campaign are lifechanging for thousands of families across New Jersey. Four new outpatient centers were opened across the state—in Bayonne, Union, Eatontown, and Toms River—and the long term care center in Mountainside underwent renovations to increase capacity and incorporate state-of-the-art technology. This expansion increased the total number of CSH treatment facilities to 15, increasing patient capacity.

Additionally, the funds raised through this campaign supported critical pediatric research studies, the expansion of specialized treatment programs, and technological upgrades that will enhance the future for children living with special healthcare needs.

We marked the completion of the three-year \$45 million Transforming Lives 2.0 capital campaign with the unveiling of the "Dream. Believe. Achieve." tribute to Todd Frazier in the new CSH Toms River outpatient center.

Frazier, and his wife, Jackie, signed on as honorary campaign co-chairs, helping to raise awareness and funds for CSH. The tribute case stands proudly in the lobby of the new CSH outpatient center on Route 37 West in Toms River and showcases Frazier's life in baseball from his beginnings in the Toms River Little League to his successful Major League Baseball career. It includes interactive elements like a height chart where kids can measure themselves against Frazier's little league and major league heights and a home plate and shoeprints built into the floor so kids can stand in Frazier's shoes and be inspired to achieve their dreams.



"This is a huge honor," said Frazier. "We take pride in our hometown and it's been a dream of ours to help our community as much we can. It is so special to us that each child can feel inspired to follow their dreams when they see this wall on their way to treatment. We look forward to doing more good work with Children's Specialized Hospital."

Campaign co-chairs and CSH Foundation board members Edward J. McKenna, Jr., Esq. of Red Bank and Mark Montenero of Toms River worked closely with the Fraziers to lead the efforts of this unprecedented campaign. CSH Launches Platform to Help Families in Need Find Assistance

The CSH Center for Discovery, Innovation and Development has been assessing the Social Determinants of Health (SDoH) of our patient families in an effort to improve quality of care by addressing each child's overall quality of life. Screening for SDoH has become part of our patient care process to determine where a family may need extra help outside what we can do at the hospital. A new partnership with findhelp to develop CSH Connect takes the hospital's SDoH efforts to the next level by allowing families and staff to search for free or reduced-cost services in ther community like financial assistance, medical care, food, job training, and much more.

Toms River Long Term Care Center Welcomes New Full-Time Therapy Dog

In August, CSH hosted a welcome party for their newest full-

time employee at the CSH Long Term Care Center in Toms River. Bear, a one-year-old Golden Retriever, joined the staff as a full time therapy dog and will work with his handler, Heidi Spiegel, to provide special dog therapy to patients, their families and his teammates on staff.

Bear is the third full-time canine staff member to join the CSH team. The benefits of pet therapy are undeniable for our patients. Interactions with dogs are



proven to have a regulatory effect on blood pressure, lower respiration rates, and reduce the amount of pain medication patients require to achieve comfort. Plus for our long term care patients, having a dog makes CSH feel more like home.

After Spending a Year in the Hospital, CSH Gave Aydin's Parents the Ability to Take Him Home

A ydin has a smile that can melt even the coldest of hearts. You would never be able to tell just how rough this sweet baby's beginning was. Shortly after his birth, it was discovered that Aydin had pneumothorax (air in the lungs) and a lacerated liver. Aydin received a tracheostomy and was put on an Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation Machine (ECMO) as a life-saving measure after his tiny heart went into cardiac arrest.

Aydin was ultimately diagnosed with C.H.A.O.S (Congenital High Airway Obstruction Syndrome), laryngeal stenosis, VSD (Ventricular Septal Defect), and an inverted anus. CHAOS affects the airway preventing one from breathing on their own.

The months that followed Aydin's birth were filled with uncertainty and stress for his parents, Yadilsa and Jamal. Aydin had multiple surgeries and procedures early in his life. At three-and-a-half months, he underwent open heart surgery to correct the VSD and a double chamber right ventricle. He remained in the NICU for five and a half months and his parents learned that their baby would ultimately be coming home on a ventilator. After working with a social worker at New York University (NYU) Langone to find the best place for Aydin's rehabilitation, it was determined that Children's Specialized Hospital (CSH) was the perfect place.

The Martin family spent the next few months at CSH. For these first-time-parents, picking up and essentially moving into CSH an hour and a half away from their home was a huge adjustment. They only slept in their bed at home two days out of the week—the rest of the nights they were by Aydin's bedside at CSH.

"We had to learn to trust a new place with providing the best care for our child. Once we realized how incredibly caring the entire team was at CSH, it was smooth sailing," said Yadilsa. "We all had a goal in mind, to train us to the best of our ability to get Aydin home. We weren't going to rush the process, because we wanted what was best for him."


During his time at the CSH New Brunswick inpatient hospital, Aydin received physical, occupational, speech, and recreational therapies. His customized schedule resulted in Aydin reaching many important milestones. He was able to spend some play time out of his crib on the floor and his parents were able to give him his first bath with water. Aydin's parents recall having to learn to trust themselves to manipulate the vent circuit when picking him up.

At CSH, Yadilsa and Jamal began to see their baby improve for the first time since his birth. One of the biggest obstacles that Aydin overcame while at CSH was his huge aversion to things in his mouth. His parents give credit to his speech therapist, Jojo, for doing her very best to orally stimulate him. By the end of Aydin's time at CSH, he was able to have tastes of breastmilk.

Aydin's parents describe him as a loving baby while at CSH. For him, everything was his favorite. He loved the many visits that he would have throughout the day from his nurses, doctors, therapist, and other staff, including Dr. Matthew B. McDonald, President, and CEO, Children's Specialized Hospital. "Every hospital should have a Matt [McDonald]," said Yadilsa. "It was a pleasure to see him pick up a child because they were crying and to see him feeding the child. He made it a point to get to know the families as well as the patients."

The Martin's recalled their top three favorite things about CSH. "Number one without a doubt is the people! Second to that was Susan (the volunteer who read to Aydin once a week), and the third was the food! We loved not having to worry about food while we were with Aydin."

The Patient and Family Nurse Educator (PFNE) program at CSH prepared the Martin family for life after CSH. This program provides direct hands-on education for patients and families on the successful use of equipment so they can safely and confidently go home from the hospital. It is vital to the health of so many medically fragile children like Aydin.



Aydin was able to finally be discharged from CSH and go home for the very first time just two weeks before his first birthday. Upon leaving, his physical strength had greatly improved. He could sit up without support, turn himself when lying in bed and grab certain toys and play independently. His biggest accomplishment, however, was standing up by himself in his crib.

"Aydin probably wouldn't be alive if it hadn't been for all the preparation we received at CSH. Every single training we received we employed within the first two weeks of Aydin being home," said Yadilsa. "Although we were approved for 24-hour nursing, it was a struggle to receive consistent care. We trained every single nurse, most had never worked with pediatric patients, and others didn't know how to work with his "attachments" (closed suction, enteral feeding, properly reading his medications, the vent, etc.). Within the first month of being home, we had to bag him, perform CPR, do an emergency trach change, change the circuit, and make him portable because the EMS didn't know how. By the time August rolled around, we knew we could handle whatever was needed not only to keep Aydin alive, but to help him thrive and grow!"

Aydin loves books and being read to. He entertains himself with the simplest of things. A plastic water bottle (he likes to squeeze it and try to open it), a napkin, and a string. The world truly is Aydin's playground. He also enjoys cuddling, music, and even dances and stomps his little feet.

Now, approaching his second birthday, Aydin is thriving and receiving therapies through an early intervention program in New York where he lives. The Martin's greatest hope for their son is that he will lead an independent life and reach his full potential. "We want him to grow and thrive and be an exceptional human," said his parents.

"Overall, if we could donate a bunch of money right now to the CSH Foundation, we would," said Yadilsa. "CSH changed our lives. We met incredible people. The love, care, and compassion we were shown is unmatched."
