Since 1984, Children's Miracle Network has raised more than **\$96 million** to support Penn State Health Children's Hospital.



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
Normalizing the **Healthcare Journey**

Pediatric Research Endowment

This endowment supports pilot projects for researchers to prove theory and concept before applying to larger external funding sources. Past projects include innovations like the 3D-heart printer technology that helped to save Miracle Child Henry's life.



Pediatric Cardiology

The new **Pediatric Cardiology Division Chief Endowment** will fund various pediatric cardiology projects. These include research on lung diseases in children, general health studies, statewide programs for healthy eating and active living, and support for the Pediatric Research Resource Office.



Patient Assistance Endowment

This endowment provides crucial support to families by covering unexpected costs like medication, medical devices, travel, food, clothing, and more, helping to ease the financial burden of a child's medical diagnosis.

Dollars at Work: CMN-Funded Pediatric Ambulance Joins Penn State Health Life Lion Critical Care Transport Fleet

The new CMN-funded ambulance features several pieces of specialty equipment, including a transport isolette for infants, a ventilator, and a more robust oxygen system as compared to a regular ambulance. It also features additional space in the patient compartment, which allows for as many as five caregivers to administer care during the transport of ill or injured infants and children.

The mobile intensive care unit provides the same advanced level of care as Penn State Health Children's Hospital. The ambulance is staffed by an emergency medical technician, critical care paramedic, and critical care transport registered nurse.

Those gathered at a news conference to view the ambulance heard from Janette Migliori, whose daughter Joella, a Children's Miracle Network Miracle Child, was transported by pediatric ambulance to Penn State Health Children's Hospital from another hospital in the region moments after she was born. Today, Joella is an energetic eight-year-old girl who loves amusement parks and crafts – and who has a special fondness for the Life Lion fleet, calling them "my ambulances."
