WHY SHOULD WE INVEST IN WATER?

Globally, 785 million people lack access to clean water. Without clean, easily accessible water, families and communities are locked in poverty for generations. Children drop out of school and parents struggle to make a living.

More than 800 children, under age 5, die every day from disease caused by contaminated water. Women and girls most often bear the burden of carrying water for their families. In Africa, they walk an average of 3.7 miles per day to get water. Often they are put at risk of wildlife, harassment, and sexual assault.

When people gain access to safe water, they are better able to practice good hygiene and sanitation. Children enjoy good health and are more likely to attend school. ABOUT KENYA



Kenya has a population of over 50 million, but the statistics are stark: Nearly 40%, that is, 20 million Kenyan fathers, mothers, and children, currently lack access to clean water sources. This results in almost 70% of the population in Kenya living near or under the poverty line.

Women and children make long, dangerous, exhausting journeys to collect dirty water for their families. A lack of private toilets in schools causes many girls to leave when they start menstruating. Health centers are overcrowded, and many have no access to water, resulting in inadequate sanitation. All of this leads to disease outbreaks. It is heartbreaking to know that 7 out of every 100 children die before turning five.

Agriculture remains the backbone of the Kenyan economy, but it's nearly impossible to survive on agriculture without access to water. Access to clean water helps solve the many factors that perpetuate poverty, like nutrition, health, education, and generating income.

Your generosity provides clean water to drink, latrines at home and schools, and hand washing stations nearby to keep entire communities clean and healthy, and with the hope of a brighter future.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES OF YOUR INVESTMENT IN KENYA "WASH"

For more than 35 years, World Vision has been committed to standing in the gap, globally leveraging resources and locally working alongside communities in Kenya to ensure millions of children have access to clean water, dignified sanitation, and healthy hygiene practices.

In partnership with World Vision, Well Loved aims to raise \$200,000 in 2023 and help 4,000+ people with clean water for a lifetime through:



Building seven new or rehabilitated water points in communities and schools ~\$100,000



Plus, providing a solar-powered water system to help provide water to 2,000+ people ~\$100,000

WORLD VISION'S APPROACH TO "WASH" IN KENYA

Water Supply

In Kenya, World Vision collaborates and coordinates efforts with local partners to construct water systems that deliver clean water to household, community, school, and/or health center taps. As they increase the installation of piped-water systems with taps, they help ensure equitable water access, reduce WASH-related diseases (such as diarrhea) and deaths, and improve child well-being.

Water Security and Resilience

World Vision supports communities to develop mitigation plans to address water scarcity and conduct watershed management activities. They also equip families with tools to practice water conservation.

Many villages experience long drought seasons, but to help build resilience, families are provided with equipment to conserve water during the rainy season in order to have enough for crops and livestock.
